## BOLTON STREET CEMETERY

The Cemetery has been formed from Wellington's first major burial ground, comprising three adjacent cemeteries which operated for half a century from the city's founding in 1840. The Cemetery contains graves of considerable historic and social interest, ranging across all sections of the community

The Cemetery is situated in the centre of Wellington between Bolton Street and Bowen Street on either side of the main motorway. It provides a central green space rich in historic artefacts and plants, for quiet exploration and appreciation of Wellington's colonial history.

Now part of the adjacent Botanical Garden, it also contains the Garden's collection of 250 heritage roses and is a heritage rose site of national importance. Within its boundaries are the old Sexton's Cottage (1857) and a replica chapel with displays and a burial list containing the names of the 8,500 people buried in the Cemetery.

## THE FRIENDS

The Friends' incorporated society was formed in 1977 out of community concern for the well-being of the Cemetery, during and following motorway construction and the need to recognise the overall values of the Cemetery. Although the society has been responsible for raising the profile of the old burial ground and preserving many elements of its history, ongoing work is needed to maintain this important conservation effort. The work is spear-headed by a small committee which is elected at each annual general meeting.

## AIMS OF THE FRIENDS

The Aim of the Society is to preserve, protect and enhance for the public benefit the three Wellington historic cemeteries now known collectively as the Bolton Street Cemetery. Its objectives include:

- Supporting Wellington City Council (WCC) in restoring graves and developing the area as an historic cemetery-park.
- Sponsoring grave repairs and encouraging families and groups to maintain graves.
- Researching historical information and heritage restoration techniques.
- Encouraging public interest in the Cemetery.

## CURRENT WORK OF THE FRIENDS

- Liaison with WCC on restoration projects, ongoing historical interpretation and general improvements.
- Development of policy and identification of guidelines, practices and priorities for the preservation and restoration of graves.
- Conducting research of the burial records for the historic cemetery and liaison with WCC for preservation and maintenance of these records.
- Preparation and publication of material about the Park, including the production of newsletters and website.
- Responding to enquiries about the Park and about people buried there.
- Conducting guided heritage tours for groups (by arrangement).

## WHY JOIN THE FRIENDS?
